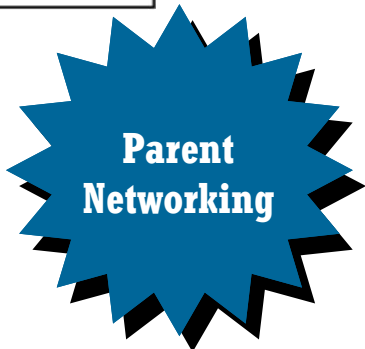

Parent Behavior Training Series



For parents of students with special needs, dealing with challenging behaviors can be difficult. Throughout the series, parents will learn tools and strategies to implement in the home environment, have an opportunity to network with other parents of children with disabilities, problem solve specific struggles and connect with community resources to support the implementation of strategies.

Tuesday, October 18, 2016

Session 1: Promoting Positive Behaviors

Parents will learn tools to develop expectations for daily routines (e.g., homework, mealtime, bedtime, getting ready for school) at home, how to set limits and how to acknowledge and promote positive behaviors.

Thursday, December 8, 2016

Session 2: Developing Social Emotional Skills

Parents will learn tools to grow social emotional skills related to identifying and managing feelings based on the Zones of Regulation curriculum. Strategies on the power of listening will be provided to understand how your child is feeling and why.

Wednesday, February 15, 2017

Session 3: Understanding and Responding to Challenging Behavior

Parents will learn specific tools to collect information on “why” their child may be engaging in the unexpected behavior and learn strategies to align with the purpose of the unexpected behavior, such as use of a “first-then” strategy.

Tuesday, April 25, 2017

Session 4: When Things Get Heated: Responding in a Crisis

Parents will learn how to identify early signs of behavior escalation and possible responses and practice strategies to reduce the possibility of physically acting out behavior. What to expect and how to partner with first responders during a behavioral crisis will be discussed.
