<p>7:30</p> <p>Student Assignment &amp; Intra-District Transfer</p>	<p><b><u>Attendance Areas</u></b> The School District is divided into school attendance areas. The Superintendent shall review the boundary lines annually and recommend any changes to the Board of Education. A map of the District showing current school attendance areas shall be maintained by the Superintendent.</p> <p>Students living in a given school attendance area shall attend that school. The Superintendent shall establish administrative procedures for approval of parental requests for student(s) to transfer to another school within the District. Students who are granted a transfer within the District shall be responsible for their own transportation.</p> <p>Homeless children shall be assigned according to Board Policy 7:60.</p>	<p><b><u>Attendance Areas</u></b> The School District is divided into school attendance areas. The Superintendent shall:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Review the boundary lines annually and recommend to the Board of Education any changes or revisions for existing units; or</li><li><b>2. Create new units using a lens that considers preventing segregation and the elimination of separating students in the District's schools because of color, race, or nationality.</b></li></ol> <p>A map of the District showing current school attendance areas shall be maintained by the Superintendent. All records pertaining to the creation, alteration, or revision of attendance units are open to the public. Students living in a given school attendance area shall attend that school. The Superintendent shall establish administrative procedures for approval of parental requests for student(s) to transfer to another school within the District. Students who are granted a transfer within the District shall be responsible for their own transportation.</p> <p>Homeless children shall be assigned according to policies 7:60 and 6:140, Education of Homeless Children.</p>
