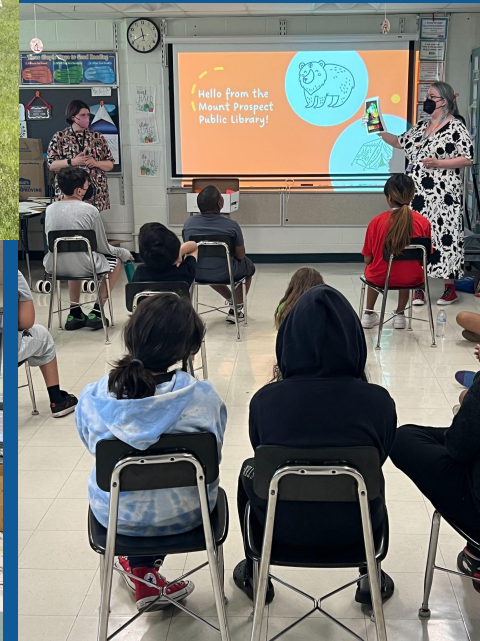
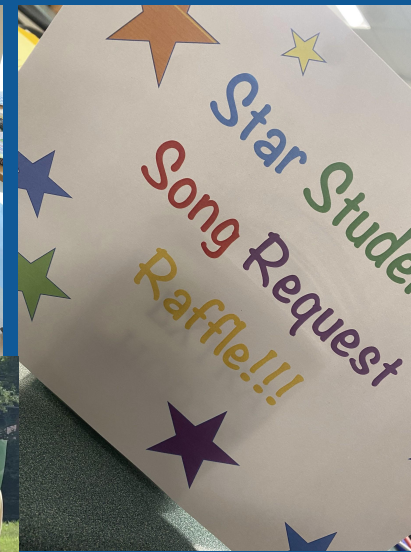
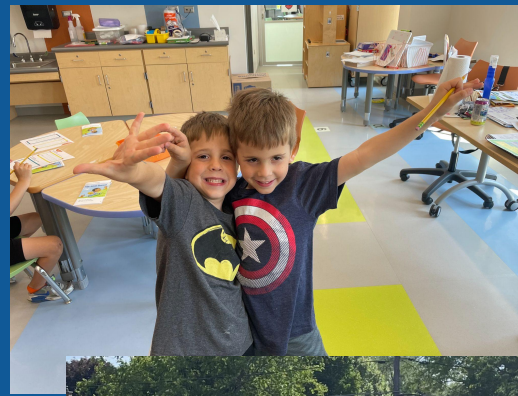
Each student had an ESY plan that showed which goal areas they have qualified under, as well as the number of minutes that were to be provided each week of ESY.

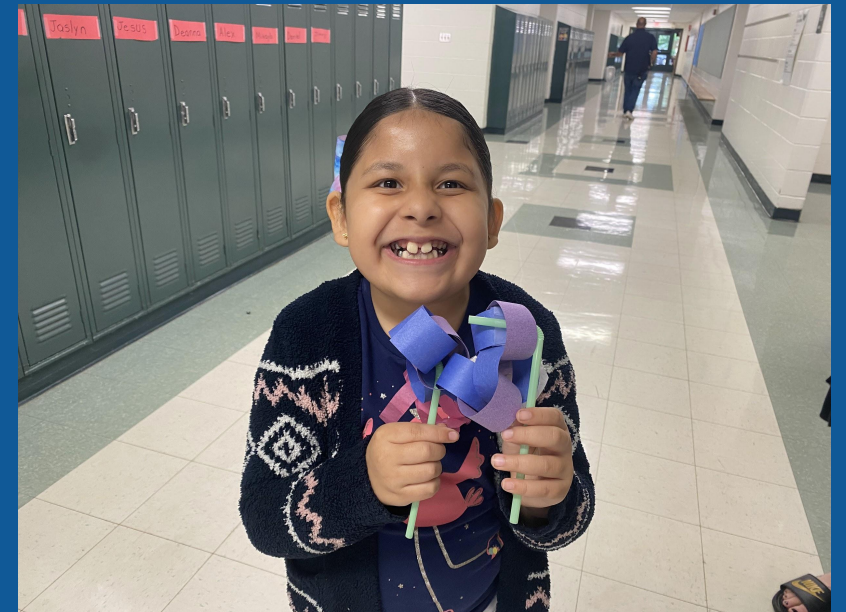

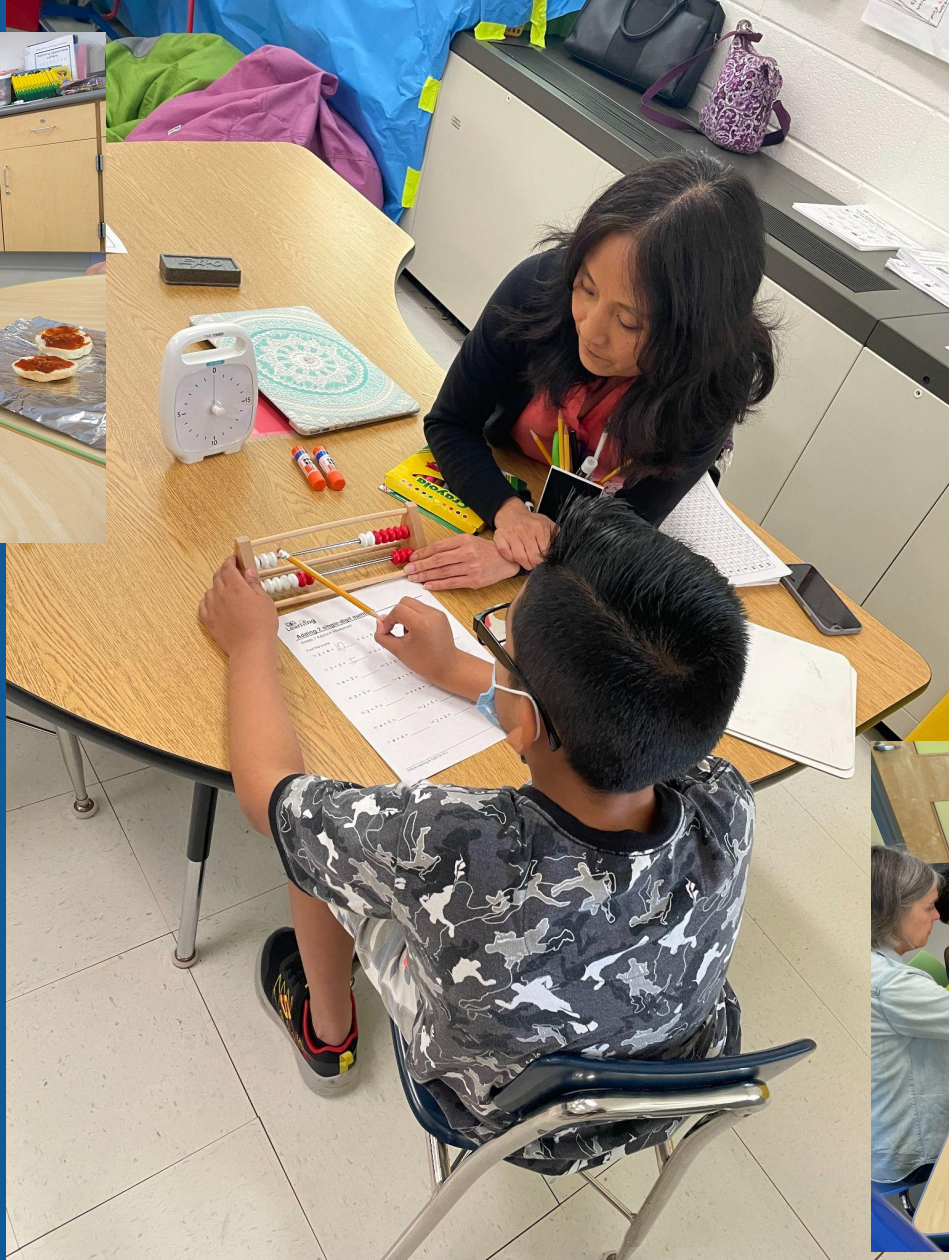
# Summer School Next Steps

- Interest-based courses focusing on student choice, creativity, and engagement while continuing emphasis on literacy and math skill development











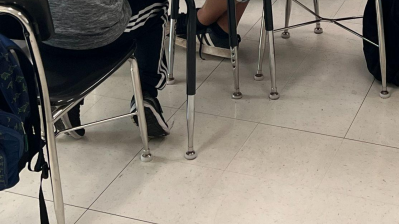
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
