







- ★ All students deserve to experience social science through the analysis of multiple, diverse, and cultural perspectives.

 - o Pilot #2: Fall 2023





- HMH: Social Studies August 2023 October 2023







The Majority Decision on Brown v. Board of Education, 1954

The landmark Supreme Court decision made in *Brown* declared that segregated schools were "inherently unequal." In his majority opinion, Chief Justice Warren used the findings of another court case to support the Supreme Court's argument for integration in schools.


