Library

HJH Librarian leads HJH students and ELC classes in partner readings of Preschool levelled books.

Classrooms:

- M: stay in your assigned area
- P: to build relationships between the preschoolers and our junior high students, facilitating opportunities for leadership and peer modeling
- **S:** I can participate appropriately in activities that build the preschooler's life skills and ability to socialize.
